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## Introduction




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- Among ILO's main means of action since its creation (1919)
" "Rules of the game" $\Leftrightarrow$ Tripartite international dialogue
- Cover matters related to work
- Take the form of Conventions or Recommendations(seldomly Protocols)



## Types of Standards...

Adopted by the International Labour Conference

Open to ratification
$\Leftrightarrow$ Legally binding (if ratified)
Ratification triggers
Constitutional obligations
(Arts. $22+23(2)+35$ )
To this day $=189$
$\neq$ Open to ratification $\neq$ Legally binding

Give Guidance (policy, legislation \& practice)
To this day $=205$

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## Reports...

## [Arts. 22 and 23(2) ILO Constitution]

- Obligation to submit a report on the measures taken $\Leftrightarrow$ give effect to the provisions of the convention(s) $\Leftrightarrow 1$ year after the entry into force for the member State [i.e. 2 years after ratification]
- Obligation to communicate the info. + report $\rightarrow$ most represent. Workers + Employers Org.


## Regular Supervisory Mechanism...

Committee on the Application of Standards (CAS)
of the International Labour

The Committee of Experts on the Application of Conventions and Recommendations (CEACR) Conference
Created in 1926 by ILC Resolution

- Tripartite conformation - Independent Experts
- Meets in May June
- Sessions $\Leftrightarrow$ Public
- >150 Members
- Meets Nov. $\sim$ December
- Sessions $\Leftrightarrow$ Private
- 20 members
